

## Centerville School NEWSLETTER





Dear Centerville School Community,

You may have seen a recent article in *The Goldendale Sentinel* regarding our school and as relates to school funding changes on the state level. The article also mentioned that the school was hosting a meeting on October 23<sup>rd</sup> to seek community input. Several inaccuracies were reported in this article, which are corrected below. In addition to these corrections, we want to clarify the intent and purpose of the meeting slated for the 23<sup>rd</sup>.

First and most importantly, we want to assure everyone that Centerville School has <u>NO PLANS</u> to close in 4 years. Our board continues to prioritize fiscal responsibility and realistic budget forecasting with an aim of providing strategic and sustainable guidance in matters that relate to the district and the education of our students. As always, our staff is steadfast in adhering to the spending parameters set forth by the board.

While we will touch on the impacts of the McCleary Bill on school funding, that aspect of our community meeting is *only a fraction of what we intend to cover*. Below is a snapshot of the agenda. As you will see, state-level school funding is just one agenda item among several others.

It has been several years since we hosted a community meeting. Our intention is to update our community on all the great things happening at Centerville School today while also looking ahead to the opportunities and challenges that we face. Included in this look-ahead is discussion around district budget, capital needs of an aging school, and the upcoming school survey and study project. The school survey and study is your chance to become involved with the school, help prioritize infrastructure needs that support student learning and growth, and position the school for funding that supports these needs.
